Does the punishment fit the crime?

History


We will be travelling through time, investigating different types of crime and learning how punishments have evolved through history, making comparisons along the way. The children will learn how our current justice system has been shaped from legacies left behind. All pupils will be visiting the Galleries of Justice in Nottingham on 22nd May to support the learning in this topic.

Literacy

The children will develop their story writing skills, by piecing together a set of items to compose an adventure story. In the second half of the term they will be exposed to texts by William Shakespeare, while Y6 pupils learn more about the man himself on their Stratford residential. With a chance to become a 'bard' themselves, their learning will culminate with their end of year production -Shakespeare Rocks.

Maths

We will be continuing to improve on our CLIC and Learn It scores through daily practice. Additionally, the children will consolidate their knowledge of various mathematical concepts through practice, reasoning and problem solving.



PE

The children will be developing their skills of striking and fielding and transferring these into small-sided game situation. We are building upon our skills of co-ordination and agility through personal challenge. This will be followed by a range of athletics in preparation for Sports Day.

PHSE

We will be looking at relationships and, as we prepare to move on or to a new year group, changes. We will also continue to promote a positive learning attitude through our GHF BRAIN muscles and rewarding their use with Class DOJO points.

ICT

The children will develop their understanding of databases and their uses and their skills in order to conduct more complex searches. Linked with our science topic, the children will be monitoring body changes and recording and manipulating data in spreadsheets.

Science Topics

Body Pump - Term 5

In this module children learn about the human circulatory system and how it enables their bodies to function. The children will carry out and illustrate a practical activity where they will make blood soup, which will model the transportation of blood and gases around the body.

Body Health- Term 6

Our focus is on lifestyle choices that humans make. These could include diet, exercise and drug use. We will then investigate how these are informed by scientific evidence. We will develop a deeper understanding of what constitutes a healthy diet through exploring food groups and how the body uses them. The children will also investigate how the results of scientific enquiries have influenced what we eat.

R.E - Muslim beliefs and lifestyles

The children will be exploring the concept of the Muslim word for God - Allah. They will develop an understanding of some of the meanings of Allah's 99 different names.
