Christmas Party

To end this term we will have a party day on 17th December, this will also be a time when we celebrate and December birthdays. It isn't possible to offer a full Christmas dinner this year so instead the kitchen will be making a Christmas Buffet which the children will eat in the classroom. If your child would like the Christmas Buffet, please order the meal in the usual way on ParentMail - there will be no other choice for lunch on that day. If your child would rather have a packed lunch from home then they will eat it in the classroom at the same time as everyone who has ordered the buffet. Please remember that we are a nut free school and any food brought from home must not contain nuts. We have a number of children with severe nut allergies.

Bible Club

Mr Buckeridge, our Chair of Governors, used to come into school to lead a Bible Club last academic year. As he is unable to run a club across the whole school at the moment he has decided to offer a remote 'postal' club for the children.

The plan would be for children who sign up, to be given an envelope on a Monday, which had been isolated over the weekend. At home, the children would watch a little video which would help them understand the story, accessed via a channel on Youtube. The children would then complete the activities in the envelope and put in a post box in the school entrance to be collected the following Friday. As they complete the lessons each week they would gain points which would lead to a reward with a little prize at the end of the half term. If you have a child born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017 they will be due to start primary school in September 2021.
