# Covid Updates

What a busy three weeks we have had! During our first week back, the year 5 and 6 children immersed themselves in Art's week – Mood in the Landscape. They experimented with different collaging techniques and learnt how to apply oil paints to give texture to their final piece. All the while considering the mood of their painting through colour choices. In the end they all produced the most fantastic volcanic landscapes. Continuing with the creative theme, the children all had the opportunity to construct 3D volcanoes using paper mâché (Thank you to all the parents who sent in bottles, card and newspaper).
