



Year 3/4 Autumn Term 2018
Who were the first people to live in Britain?



R.E

The children will be learning about faith and community within Hinduism and Islam. We will be exploring key beliefs, worship and festivals. This will lead up to a visit to a Hindu temple and a mosque in January.

P.E

This term the focus is invasion games and dance.

PHSE & SEAL

We are looking at New Beginnings to help the children become settled into their new classes, focussing on developing the skills to build new friendships and maintain existing ones. During our reflection time we will be working on our school values Service and Forgiveness.

Home Learning

Home learning is intended to provide practice to support on-going class work and is usually given out on a **Wednesday** and is due back in on **Monday**. The Home Learning project will allow children to choose an aspect of Prehistoric life to research further. Details to follow shortly.

History Topic

This topic will provide an interesting insight into the life and impression left by people from prehistoric times. We will be developing historical enquiry skills which will enable the children to answer many of their fantastic questions. Starting with our Flag Fen trip, we will examine archaeological evidence and carry out research to gain an understanding of life from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. The children will learn about the importance of archaeology and experience what life may have been like in a Bronze Age roundhouse. Using different sources of information to find out about lifestyles, the children will make comparisons between the first people to live in Britain and people living today.



Computing

To help the children research independently, we will be teaching them how to search for information efficiently, effectively and safely. In addition, the children will be creating a multimedia presentation to showcase what they have learned through our history topic.

Art

We will be practising our colour mixing skills and looking at warm and cool colours and the moods these create in a piece of artwork reflecting different times of day at Stonehenge.

English

We will be exploring information texts to help us write our own information leaflet about Flag Fen. All of the children will be developing their skills to retrieve and infer information to answer questions and their understanding of a text. Spelling lessons, will focus on the rules and patterns the children need to practise. While grammar lessons will help the children to improve their writing and editing skills.

Maths

Number and place value in our key focus this term. We will be making sure the children are secure in using a range of calculation methods to solve problems. To support this we will be working on our quick recall of number facts through Big Maths.

Science

Initially, we will investigate how we need light to see, how objects reflect light and how shadows are formed.

After half term, we will explore sound and how it is made. This will involve learning about pitch and volume.

Throughout both of these topics we will be developing our investigative skills.

You can help your child by:

Making sure they read regularly; practise their spellings, tables and Learn Its, and complete their homework in the time given. Please also make sure your child has appropriate PE kit in school.
