

We had our Macmillan coffee morning, and it was lovely to see so many families come and join the class and enjoy some cake in the school hall.


Everyone has commented on the children's manners and how well the children have adapted to the school day. Well done, Explorers!























Pathfinders have had a great start to the new school term!

In maths, we have been comparing numbers of more, fewer and the same, using dominoes or dice.

We have learnt about semiphore flags and how to spell out our names.

In art, we have been learning about shades of colour, and how to make different tones by adding black and white. We have also been experimenting with photo effects, making images back and white and then slowly introducing colour back in.

In our history lessons, we have explored how television has changed over time, and how we have so many more channels and freedom to watch when we choose.









Year 2 Pathfinders have had a great start to the new school year!

We have been looking at two digit numbers, and number bonds in maths. We have also learned about place values, using shapes to look at tens and ones.

PE channelled our inner frogs, as we practicised our jumping skills and how we use our arms for greater movement.



A focus this term is the media and how it is used by us.

One part of the topic was communication, and how people talked to each other long before all the technology we now have. We discovered how to send messages using flags, and the children quickly learned how to signal to each other.



In Art we have explored colour and tints, and how adding different shades and tones to paint can create something new. We also applied this theory in ICT, taking photographs and changing the colours into black and white.









The Adventurers classes have settled into the new school year beautifully.

Our new Navigators classes have settled into their new classes wonderfully, and we have had a great September term.

We have been learning about planets and space, painting such creative and colourful creations of the solar system. We mixed primary colours to make different tints, and saw how colours can be altered from primary to secondary shades. The trip to the space centre was a highlight of the term and enjoyed by all of the children (and the accompanying staff!)

We have been learing about column addition and subtraction in maths, alongside a word problem solving game to gain flags. The first to get 10 flags was the winner!

We unleashed our creativity with our time keeping topic, designing our won time keeping devices and interviewing an alien! We also drew pictures of our dreams and aspirations.

We have played volleyball in PE, and even got creative on a wet day and played ballon volleyball! So much fun!

















