



School Uniform

Many items of non-personalised uniform (such as grey trousers and white shirts) are also available at most supermarkets. Book bags, water bottles, ties and woolly hats are available at our School Office.

Girls

- Red V necked cardigan/jumper with logo
- Grey skirt, trousers, shorts or pinafore dress
- White blouse
- Red tie
- Red gingham dresses and white polo shirts may be worn during the summer term only

Boys

- Red V necked jumper with logo
- Grey trousers or shorts
- White shirt
- Red tie
- White polo shirts may be worn during the summer term only

Footwear

Black sensible shoes (not trainers) should be worn all year. Sensible boots may be worn in bad weather but dry shoes need to be brought to wear indoors.

It is a good idea that Reception pupils also have a pair of wellingtons in school, along with a waterproof coat.

All clothing (including footwear) should be labelled with the owner's name.

PE and Games

- Red school T-shirt with logo or plain red T-shirt
- Black shorts
- Plimsolls or sensible trainers (for outdoor PE and games)
- Drawstring PE bag

Children with long hair will be required to have their hair tied back for P.E. so a hair band at school is a must.

Jewellery

Earrings and other jewellery **should not** be worn to school. In the case of recently pierced ears (and for a short time only), studs are allowed but these must be covered by tape/plasters for PE lessons, playtimes and for activities in the outdoor learning area. It is suggested that parents should time the piercing of ears for the summer holidays, allowing time for the ears to heal so earrings can easily be removed for school.

Personal belongings

We ask that children do not bring non-essential or inappropriate items of value to school. However, when personal items are used as an aid to learning e.g. calculators, we ask that the children do not leave them at school overnight. We ask that all children's property is named, including purses for dinner money, clothing etc. Pupils are responsible for security of their personal possessions and school cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.
