

Thank you all for your continued support of the school and your children. The questionnaire that over 200 of you completed earlier this term shows 99% of you report your child feeling safe at school and 98% that they are happy. With 99% also saying that they feel there is a good range of subjects available to their child at the school, it felt like a real celebration of the hard work and dedication of the staff across school.



We were so pleased to finally go to our Zoo visits from last term, it was most definitely worth waiting for and we showed real resilience in making it happen. The children had a fantastic experience and loved the day out which consolidated their learning from the end of last year.



This term we haven't been so fortunate and despite our best efforts have not been able to afford some of the experiences we would have liked for the children. Just like all of you, our bills are going up and up but as yet the government have not given us any more money and we have been unable to find the shortfall. We have done everything we can to ensure that despite not going out we have made our curriculum engaging and interesting for the children.
