What a great start to the new year! We have been learning all about the alphabet, making lists of words in alphabetical order.

In Science, we have been learning about different materials and how we can change them into different shapes.



In Maths, we have been looking at the numbers 11 - 19, and all the ways we can use them to make 20. We have used our number lines to work out how close numbers are to each other.

How do you make an umbrella? We looked at materials to see if they were waterproof. In PSHE we have learned about what makes a good friend and how to share successfully.



What are the differences between life in the UK and the Arctic? We have talked about differences in food, houses and clothing. Ask your child what differences they can tell you!











In English we have been working on expanded noun phrases, learning how to build up on a noun word. We have also begun a new text, and have read the story and then used drama to re-tell it.



In Maths we have been learning about money in pounds and pence, and how to count this up.



In Science, we have been looking at shapes and the properties of solid objects. We also looked at what makes objects waterproof and what would make a good umbrella.

In Art, we have been looking at different materials and putting them into categories.









Year 3 and 4









The children have been creating Banksy style artwork, which is linked to their topic, 'Cry Freedom'.



In science, we have been learning about shadows, making different shapes with objects and torches.



In PE the children are working on their fitness and multi skills in circuit training, focusing on improving their balance and coordination.



We have been learning about modern day slavery in history. The children read letters about a young man telling his story, and then presented what they had learned to the class.

How do we use centimetres and millimetres? The children have been learning to convert measurements and have been using their knowledge to measure things in the classroom.









In RE we have started new topic, Creation and Science. We have looked at the Big Frieze and identified bible links, stories and pictures within it.

We prepared for our cultural celebration event in Art, making portraits in the style of Picasso so show how art can portray messages.



We have had circuit training in PE lessons - so many different areas to use and train - we were all worn out!

Our PCSO visited the classes to teach us about the impact of hate crime on society.

The class learnt about Nelson Mandela so that they could present a timeline about his story to the class.

















The children did a fantastic job researching the life of Nelson Mandela to understand how he changed South African society. Please ask your child to tell you what they have learnt.

We have played games to consolidate our understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages.

In computing, we have used a program called Scratch to simulate physical systems.

In PSHE we spoke about why some drugs are illegal, and how this can affect people's health. The children tackled this subject with maturity and asked some very thoughtful questions.
